The Aspiring Senior Leader Programme (ASLP) will develop your skills as a senior leader in school and prepare you to build and lead high performing teams. You will explore how effective leadership can improve outcomes for students in classes.

OBJECTIVES

Senior leaders have an essential role to establish the school culture and to translate the school's vision into practice. Outstanding schools need high quality senior leaders who seek to continuously improve and who can secure and build high performing teams.

It is essential that we identify, develop and retain the next generation of school leaders. These emerging leaders are at the heart of successful schools.

The core objective of the ASLP is:

- To develop leadership skills, knowledge and mind-sets, which can be used immediately to impact beyond their own classroom by raising standards and the quality of provision.

ELIGIBILITY

The ASLP programme is open to current middle leaders in primary and secondary who are seeking to progress to senior leadership roles. This programme is also suitable for current senior leaders new to their role

Applicants need to demonstrate:

- a strong commitment to improving Teaching and Learning
- the skills to inspire colleagues
- the mindset and values to be role models for staff and students
- the ability to become outstanding leaders
- a commitment to professional development
- skills to evaluate their own practice and that of colleagues
- a willingness to develop their skills to influence and empower students and staff to excel.

IMPACT AND EVALUATION

As part of the programme you will research and lead a session on a chosen area of school improvement that demonstrates your leadership skills and qualities.

You will have the opportunity to share your findings, and celebrate your success, with governors and school leaders at the end of the academic year.
